



5. **Describe** DDM #1, content area, grade level, what you will be assessing over time (be specific). How will this be scored? Rubric, raw score, percent, etc?

6. **Describe** DDM #2, content area, grade level, what you will be assessing over time (be specific). How will this be scored? Rubric, raw score, percent, etc?

7. **Describe** how you will measure growth between baseline and follow-up assessment? [e.g. differences in raw scores, percent change, improvement on a rubric, etc.] Label and describe for DDM #1 and DDM #2.

8. The ratings for impact on student learning are based on three levels: low, moderate, and high. Moderate represents what would be expected as “one year’s growth”; this category has the largest spread. Below expected or one year’s growth is “low” and significantly above one year’s growth is “high.”

Thinking about your scoring, what might you expect as a range that describes the three categories for each DDM?

**Do not forget to identify each DDM with its scoring range.** This is a draft prior to creating the actual DDM, you can revisit this after the DDM is created. However, before the assessments are given, the scale must be determined and approved by your supervisor.

9. Okay, now go to work developing the DDM. Remember, if there are others doing a DDM in this same area, your assessments **MUST** be the same!!!
